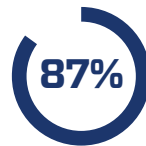
Our Students

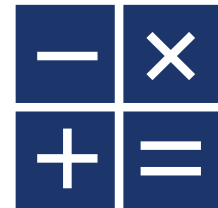
