Athletic Trainer

This full-time, 10 month, staff position administers athletic training services in a secondary school community setting under the supervision of an orthopedic physician, director of sports medicine, and school nurse.

These services include, but are not limited to the following:

- injury prevention programs and prehabilitation/injury prevention
- athlete injury consults and referrals to affiliate providers as needed
- evaluates injuries and develops treatment and exercise plans within the scope of practice.
- documents patient evaluation and treatment per professional and regulatory standards
- the case management of injured athletes/clients undergoing rehabilitation for non-surgical and surgical repair of injuries
- implements individualized therapeutic interventions, and monitors responses to therapy to ensure client safety
- concussion management and annual baseline screening
- game and practice coverage

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's degree in Athletic Training or related field from an accredited university athletic training program
- Possess Athletic Trainer licensure in the state of Massachusetts
- Certification or registration from the state
- Current BOC certification
- Emergency Cardiac Care certification
- Requires the ability to work collaboratively with physicians and other healthcare providers
- Must have strong written and verbal communication skills, as well as strong interpersonal communications and human relation skills to effectively communicate with coaches, parents, and administrators
- Physical demands including lifting up to 80 pounds and working outdoors in all elements
